- 2.00 A work session will be held regarding the American Rescue Plan Act prior to the Regular Commissioners Court meeting.
- 3.00 <u>Discuss, consider and/or take action regarding the American Rescue Plan Act and funding for Lubbock County.</u>

Upon a motion by Chad Seay, seconded by Jason Corley, the court unanimously voted to approve that Lubbock County appropriate Three Point five Million dollars (\$3.5 million) from the American Rescue Plan Act special fund to StarCare Specialty Health System as partial funding for the Hope Center for Health and Well being. As presented by Curtis Parrish.

Upon a motion by Chad Seay, seconded by Gilbert Flores, the court voted Four (4) for with Jason Corley against to approve that Lubbock County appropriate Three Point Two Million dollars (\$3.25 Million) from the American Rescue Plan Act special fund to the City of Lubbock as partial funding to create the Lubbock City/County Health Department, to provide health services needs to the rural communities and the unincorporated areas of Lubbock County. As presented by Curtis Parrish.

Upon a motion by Terence Kovar, seconded by Chad Seay, the court unanimously voted to approve that Lubbock County appropriate Five Million Dollars (\$5.0 million) from the American Rescue Plan Act special fun for Micro Grants to Small businesses in Lubbock County adversely effected by the COVID-19 pandemic. As presented by Curtis Parrish.

Upon a motion by Curtis Parrish, seconded by Terence Kovar, the court voted three (3) for and Jason Corley and Chad Seay against to approve that Lubbock County appropriate Four Million One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (4.150 million) to provide Premium Pay for Lubbock County Employees. This money will be given to Lubbock County employees who meet the U.S. Treasury guidelines standard of 150 percent of the state's average annual wage for all occupations, as defined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics. As presented by Curtis Parrish.

Upon a motion by Curtis Parrish, seconded by Terence Kovar, the court unanimously voted to approve that Lubbock County appropriate Five Million Dollars (\$5.0 million) from the American Rescue Plan Act special fund to Lubbock Economic Development Alliance for infrastructure in the negative economic impact area of East 19th Street and Loop 289. As presented by Curtis Parrish.



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4.00 <u>Discuss, consider and/or take action to amend and adopt local rules and decorum of the Commissioners Court in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code.</u>

Motion by Jason Corley to amend the amendment to the Rules of Procedure, Conduct and Decorum at meeting of Lubbock county Commissioner's Court to remove the last line; An agenda item may be removed before for consideration with the approval of three members of the Commissioners Court prior to the posting of the meeting.

Upon a motion by Curtis Parrish, seconded by Chad Seay, the court voted Three (3) for with Gilbert Flores abstaining and Jason Corley against, to amend and adopt local rules and decorum of the Commissioners Court in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code. As presented by Curtis Parrish.
