## RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION GREEN LIGHT FOR VETERANS

**WHEREAS**, the residents of Lubbock County have great respect, admiration, and the utmost gratitude for all the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this county in the Armed Forces; and

**WHEREAS**, the contributions and sacrifices of those who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens; and

WHEREAS, Lubbock County seeks to honor individuals who have made countless sacrifices for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and

**WHEREAS**, veterans continue to serve our community in the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, religious groups, and civic organizations, to help fellow former service members access to health, disability and compensation benefits each year; and

**WHEREAS**, approximately 200,000 service members nationwide transition to civilian communities annually; and an estimated 20 percent increase of service members will transition to civilian life in the near future; and

**WHEREAS**, studies indicate that 44-72 percent of service members experience high levels of stress during transition from military to civilian life; and

**WHEREAS**, active military service members transitioning from military service are at a high risk for suicide during their first year after military service; and

**WHEREAS**, Lubbock County appreciates the sacrifices of our United States military personnel and believes specific recognition should be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, through participation in **Operation Green Light**, Lubbock County reaffirms its commitment to ensuring that veterans know they are seen, respected, and honored by the people they served; and

**WHEREAS**, this initiative provides an opportunity for civic unity, public education, and the strengthening of relationships between veterans and the wider community;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, with designation as a Green Light for Veterans County, Lubbock County hereby declares **November 4-11, 2025**, as a time to salute and honor the service and sacrifices of those transitioning from active service; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Lubbock County Commissioners Court proudly supports Operation Green Light in Lubbock County and will illuminate the Lubbock Courthouse in green light, and further encourages all residents, businesses, and community organizations to display green lights during the designated week in a visible show of appreciation for the service and sacrifice of our Lubbock County veterans.
