**WHEREAS**, CR 7130 from 100 feet east of CR 2500/MLK, Jr. Boulevard to CR 2540 is an access route for local businesses that accommodate heavy truck traffic; *and*

**WHEREAS**, CR 7130 provides access to a historical landmark; *and*

**WHEREAS**, Lubbock County previously improved CR 7130 from CR 2500/MLK, Jr. Boulevard to 100 feet east of that intersection; *and*

**WHEREAS**, the remaining 3,150 feet of CR 7130 to CR 2540 are in need of improvement to an all-weather surface; *and*

**WHEREAS**, the Court is in favor of the in-house overlay of the CR 7130 Project; *and*

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF LUBBOCK COUNTY:** THAT the Court does hereby endorse the funding of the in-house overlay by the County of Lubbock for the CR 7310 Project from 100 east of CR 2500/MLK, Jr. Boulevard to CR 2540.
